  - A parishioner has agreed to repair the circular bench and Cllrs hoped it would be done soon.

Councillor Kent brought a sketch of the map he was drawing for Church Wood. Cllrs were very pleased and made a few amendments. Cllrs agreed they liked the map stand from Recycled Furniture and asked for a new quotation, along with a quotation to print the board from EPS Halesworth. The Clerk was asked to look for some grants to fund the project. Action: Clerk

The Chair has chased the missing Nature Reserve sign and post again with Suffolk County Council and received a response on the 29<sup>th</sup> January 2025. The Chair was advised 'SCC are looking how to secure funding for us to be able to (among other enhancements to the network) renew, replace and/or repair posts for the RNRs'.

#### a) Homersfield Green Damage - South Norfolk Charity Tractor Run

Cllrs and parishioners were very upset when the South Norfolk Charity Tractor Run decided to stop on the village green, causing large ruts and squashing daffodils. The village green is the main focus in this lovely conservation village, and the Chair has been in contact with the organiser, who has agreed to repair the damage caused, but no action has been taken as yet.

#### c) Homersfield Canoe Portage Platform Removal

A letter has been received from the Environment Agency advising: 'The Environment Agency plans to remove two canoe portage platforms on the River Waveney at Homersfield. The platforms, installed in 2005, became unsafe due to erosion, and there is no funding to repair them. As they no longer serve a flood management purpose, they

will be removed later this year to prevent injury'.

- The Chair contacted Katie Utting from the River Waveney Trust and was advised:
- 1. The portage is rarely used and is considered unsafe, roped off for safety.
- 2. If the location is correct, the portage is unnecessary, but water levels and obstructions should be considered.
- 3. The portage has not been used, as the riffles are passable at various water levels, though SUP users might find it trickier. The lower portage is in poor condition, so removal seems likely.
- 4. The portage is generally passable without issue, but to provide a definitive response, she would need to inspect it again, offering to visit on Friday afternoon. After discussion Councillors Approved the Chair to respond to Broadland Asset Performance Team raising concerns about the possible removal of two canoe portage platforms on the River Waveney at Homersfield. Despite the river not being classed as navigable, canoeists use it when it becomes not too reedy. Removing the portage could force canoeists to use the riffles, which could damage habitats and be unsafe for inexperienced paddlers. The River Waveney Trust and a local scout leader both support repairing and retaining the platforms. The Parish Council requested that the decision be reconsidered, despite budget constraints.
- d) Village Communication & Welcome Information *update* Cllrs plan to have the postcard included in the September Community News parish magazine.

#### e) Homersfield Community Park

Cllr Bird, the Chair of the Community Play Park, informed that they are hoping the play area will open on Saturday, 12th April. The maintenance has gone well and the play area is looking very good. Cllrs asked the Clerk to forward a copy of possible signage for the play area.
